I set up some canopies and BBQ'ed some sausages we had at home from the pigs we'd raised, and hung out "down by the river" for several hours. We got to talk to sooooo many people, and let them know of the church that would be starting just 200 feet away. (don't worry, the property itself is on top of the hill and is in no danger from the river rising). I couldn't have dreamed up a better outreach opportunity if I'd tried. Please don't misunderstand, my heart hurts for those who were more seriously affected by the flooding and we did what we could in bringing fuel and so on, but God does promise to work things for His Glory, and I believe on Sunday, He used a flooding riverbank for the furtherance of the Gospel.
