Please also join us in praying for the Lord to work out the logistics to restart our Bible Institute. We were hopeful for that to begin in January. We have run into some logistical problems getting the needed materials to Kiribati. This comes of no surprise, but we have seen God answer similar prayers just as He did with the Kiribati Bibles. We have people eager to begin and no doubt this is an attack of Satan. We are thankful God already has the victory. Here in the Northwest, we have seen God at work. We are thankful for the students who we have had the privilege to work with this semester. Currently, there are 7 students training here this semester. The four young men who are here are all majoring in Pastoral Studies. What an awesome privilege to be a part of seeing the next generation take up the baton. Would you pray with us that God will do a mighty work in and through these students as they seek



God's will for their futures. Together, we have had the awesome opportunity to assist Dan and Lindsay Grover in a new church plant in Libby, Montana. It has been exciting to see God work and to be a part of the birth of this church. Just this month, we also hosted a youth winter retreat. Praise the Lord that 3 teenagers put their trust in Christ alone for Salvation. In April, Brooke will also be hosting a Pastor's Wives' Retreat here at The Passage Northwest. This retreat is dear to our hearts. We seek to be a blessing to each Pastor's Wife and Missionary's Wife who will be attending. Please pray for God to be glorified and for hearts to be encouraged.

I also continue to be an interim for Clark Fork Baptist Church as we not only seek to see new works planted, but to strengthen the things which remain. The need for Pastor's in America is great. Emergency Room doctors were nonconclusive of the cause and thought maybe it was an idiopathic one-time issue. Unfortunately, the blood has returned. We have once again run into issues getting him into a specialist here in the Northwest. Will you please join us in praying he will be able to see a Urologist soon, but most of all that God would completely heal his body.
