We have lost two families recently, but they are still serving the Lord in their local areas, and we have a family wanting to attend our services and are in the midst of moving house in order to do that.

Other news is that our Cake Day outreach is growing in numbers and new people being reached with the gospel, as well as adding to the support of one of our church missionary's ministries.

Morgan, who was saved over a year ago through receiving one of our New Testaments through his door, continues to attend, was baptised, and now encouraging his friends to come along on Sunday mornings.

Missionary work is not only witnessing and church ministries, it is doing other jobs as well. Our church rents a room in an old building that we share with an electrical company.
