Important Prayer Request!!!

Our family of 4 raised support and moved to Liberia in 2016. Although our family has more than doubled in size, we have not had to raise any additional support, largely due to the substantial Canada Child Tax Benefit we receive. When we applied to add Ethan to this benefit, the CRA started asking a lot of questions, and we had to fill out over 100 pages of forms to substantiate our Canadian residency claim. So far we have not heard back, so **we ask you to pray** that it will be determined that we are genuine Canadian residents, so that we do not lose this income source.
