Dear Friends,

This prayer letter is about youth camps this summer.

Camp is a time when young people can get away from their family and friends and routine and get closer to the Lord. The result is often making lifelong decisions that bring honor and glory to our great Savior. Sometimes the decision is to go to Bible College and spend their lives in full time Christian service.

Many of the graduates of IBC who have their own Bible College will have their own camps and youth conferences.

Most of the graduates do not have Bible Colleges, so those pastors in an area will usually get together and plan their camp. This summer our staff and students participated in 27 of these camps. A smaller camp like below will meet in one of the churches.

Most camps have morning line ups where the campers do exercises before breakfast. The young people above are part of one of the largest camps with over 500 campers.



One of the activities of this camp is mud volleyball. I guess I am too old to understand why young people get excited about playing in the mud.

But as you see in this picture the "joy" on their faces. These activities bring the campers together although I can't explain why.

At the same camp the organizers went to the local fire station and asked if they could come to the camp and spray all the campers. It was a good idea for the firefighters as they gave a message on fire safety before opening their fire hoses on the crowd of several hundred campers. The church who organized this camp has a basketball league for the firefighters, Police officers and other groups as it has an outdoor basketball court. Quite a few of the Police Officers and Firefighters have come to know the Lord as Savior from this ministry.

The mountain area is a perfect place for youth camps as there are numerous waterfalls and places for hiking. It is cooler up there and a refreshing place to visit during the hot, humid summer. One night after the service some of the pastors went to the river to catch some freshwater crabs. Brother Nic, the practical joker, later that night went to the place where Brother



Hernando was sleeping. He took a couple of crabs and threw them on him and shined a light at him. Hermando woke up and started chasing Nic with one of those crabs around the camp yelling at him waking up the whole camp, including me.

I told the leader of the camp to find the two campers who did that and send them back home in the morning. The next morning the leader asked me if I was sure if it was a good idea to send them home and I said yes. He said it might be a problem since the ones involved were the two speakers! I couldn't help but laugh. The campers loved it so much that it ended up being one of the best camps.
