Dear Pastors and Friends,

It has been far longer than I intended between letters and for that, I apologize. I value your prayers and I am very thankful for those of you who read our letters and lift us up in prayer!

The past several months have been a mixture of blessings and challenges. I had the opportunity to travel back to the city of Pointe Noire to help with the installation of a new radio tower and solar system for one of the main Christian radio stations in the country. It was great to see people come together from around the world with the goal of making the gospel more consistently accessible to the Congolese people.





The Lord also blessed us with a new house. It has been a huge blessing. For the first time since living in Congo, our boys have a yard where they can play and some room to run around outside! They are loving every second of it!

Our challenges have come primarily with our health and our hearts. Over the past months, we have had two miscarriages.

The first was very early and did not require any medical intervention. The second was much more difficult physically. After several hospital visits, many medications, and several weeks of bed rest, we lost the baby near the end of the first trimester. Kelci endured the necessary medical procedures which, here in Congo, were performed without anesthesia or pain medication. The boys didn't fully understand everything that was going on, but they patiently sat with us in waiting rooms and doctors' offices for the seventeen hours needed for all of the appointments and procedures. Our hearts are still grieving the loss of our two little ones, but we are thankful that the Lord protected Kelci from complications that would have been more dangerous for her.

We continue working to make new contacts, build relationships, and build a foundation for ministry. We are working to establish a ministry organization that will be recognized by the government and will serve as the foundation both our ministry and, prayerfully, many others that the Lord will send to work with us and after us.
