We have been able to make some great progress regarding arriving in Ottawa. In my last prayer letter, one of my prayer requests was that my house would sell in a timely manner. My wife and I prayed specifically that we would be able to list our house on the market before the end of spring. Low and behold, we listed it the last day of spring (June 19th)! Upon listing our house, my real estate agent gave a disclaimer about the current market - he told me that, with the influx of inventory and the unstable economy, the average home in my area would likely take three months to sell. Praise be to God, our house sold in just two weeks! I sure am glad that we serve a God that goes against the odds!



As we began to pack up all our belongings, we couldn't help but think of all the great memories made in this house that we would soon be leaving. As my wife and I sat at the dinner table with tears in our eyes reminiscing, we heard a noise coming from out front that sounded like a hammer hitting a nail. As we got up to see what it was, we realized that it was the real estate agent driving an iron spike into the ground in preparation for the listing sign to go up.
