He served the Lord in Togo, Africa for 34 years, and speaks fluent French. It was encouraging to hear the reports of how our church people took care of him and his wife while they were here.

Since May, our electrical grid has been experiencing frequent brownouts. So far, it has ruined several appliances, including our oven, washing machine, well pump, and refrigerator. We are praying about going solar.
