**An Open House and Witness in the Community**

In September, we were invited to a open house party. In Thai tradition, if you build or move to a new house, it is expected that a party, called a **ขึ้นบ้านใหม่**, will be hosted for friends and neighbors to celebrate with your family. Because of the intricate ties between the Buddhist religion, and Thai daily life, for most Thai Buddhist families, monks and offerings will be involved in this party.

A Thai Christian friend, K. Jaan, opened a new part of her house this fall. Many Thai Buddhists would be hesitant to visit a church, but K. Jaan realized they would joyfully come to a new house opening. Instead of monks, and offerings, several Thai pastors had the opportunity to share briefly, and her church family sang hymns of praise in the street. K. Jaan's unsaved family members traveled from eastern Thailand to be a part of the celebration. We pray opportunities like these will plants seeds in the hearts of the attendees. as the gospel is shared and a faithful witness maintained.

## English Class Outreach

At this time, English classes remain a beneficial outlet of outreach for our team at Sila. For many years, our teammate has taught English at a local college. This fall, for the first time for this group, we hosted an English outing to our church, Sila Baptist Church. Our teammate assembled a group of English-speaking missionaries to host discussion groups for a morning at the church. The students included local college students, migrants from Myanmar, and Buddhist monks.

In each of the groups, the facilitators had the opportunity to share clearly the gospel, as well as answer questions that students might have about what it means to be a Christian.

The teacher of the class, K. Naan, has known members of our team for the past ten years, and has heard the gospel many times, but hasn't yet responded. In a neat example of God's sovereignty, a former team member, Amie Chermue and her husband, Luka Chermue stopped by the church that morning on a visit from their church plant in Phrae. Amie was once again able to sit with K.Naan and share the gospel.

Many times, ministry in Thailand is the slow working of building relationships, faithfully sharing the gospel, and praying for the Lord to work in hearts. We're praying the Lord would bless the efforts of Sila Baptist Church.
