building. If you have ever been involved with a big construction project, you know that it's the little details that take the longest. But God is helping us get it done, including a beautiful new exterior fence and a church sign on the building, as well as decorative bricks for landscaping (also pictured above). Many small projects remain to be completed as we have had to redo some things such as the roof as we discovered several water leaks. Pray that God would provide for the remaining projects. Every time we think we are getting close to finishing, something else pops up that has to be done or redone. On the health front, we still need your prayers. Caden, our youngest is still having difficulties. The doctor is beginning to suspect that the new medicine is not working. He continues to have a lot of abdominal pain and has been throwing up blood. Please pray that the doctors can figure out the best method to treat him. But we are thankful that, in spite of so many difficulties, he is not getting discouraged and when possible, is continuing his university studies and working. We also received word that our oldest son, Brenden, was in the ICU, due to pancreatic problems and extremely high triglycerides. The nurse told us that his blood was basically like jelly. He was in the ICU for several days but has been released with follow-up treatments for the next year. Please pray for his recovery as well.

On a heavier note, one of the grandmother's in the church passed away suddenly from a heart attack. She was always faithful in bringing her grandkids to church. I have spoken to other family members about the importance of continuing to bring them and have agreed to do so. During the funeral, I had the opportunity to preach the Gospel to nearly 200 people. Pray that the seeds that were planted will grow to salvation.
