Dear Prayer Partners,

Furlough is officially in full swing. In February, we hit the road full time and visited Indiana, Ohio, North Carolina and Virginia before returning to Alabama for a couple weeks. Then, in March, we hit the road with our camper. Housing eight people in a 31-foot camper has its challenges, but we're hoping we can all see the adventure in it and enjoy the journey as we are blessed to travel all over the eastern half of the United States. We already got to see the Creation Museum and have several other fun outings planned as we travel. Please continue to pray for our safety and our sanity as we navigate the logistics of travel, coordinating the schedules, and homeschooling four children. My (Nathan's) parents hope to travel with us some of the time with their own camper in order to help with all of that, and we are blessed by the investment they are willing to make in our family.



As we have traveled, we have noticed that gas prices have recently risen, but we praise the Lord for His abundant provision. Every church we have visited has been more than generous with us and the camper helps us greatly reduce lodging expenses. Thank you to each one who continues to give so we can fully devote ourselves to this phase of ministry, both as we minister to and with different churches along the way, and the ministry of our family.

Please continue to pray for the churches back in Chile. The San Pedro church was sad to lose a key family in the church recently over several minor issues that eventually broke the camel's back. We trust this will be a growing point for everyone involved and continue to pray for the family to return with a right attitude. But their loss hasn't stopped the growth of the church. I am encouraged to frequently see new faces on the security cameras and to hear the reports that Pastor Juan Carlos sends us. Miguel, Evelyn's husband, the same Miguel who got saved a year ago, led the song service for the first time!

Please pray for Pastor Juan Carlos and his family as they recently suffered the loss of the second floor of their home along with everything in it due to a fire. By God's grace, and perhaps in part due to the fact that Miguel is a firefighter, the firefighters were able to put out the fire before it reached the first floor. There was only some water damage to the first floor, due to the water used by the firefighters. Pastor Juan Carlos suffered burns to his right hand; but, other than that, no bodily injuries were sustained. I am thrilled to see the church family pitching in and helping with the labor of removing the burnt wreckage and taking up an offering to help him rebuild (house insurance is almost non-existent in Chile). We offered to purchase the roofing for him and his brother-in-law (Fernando), who suffered the same loss due to the same fire. Pray for Fernando, that God might soften his heart to the gospel through all this. That might cost about \$5,000, but we really don't want to do any more than that, as we would rob the Chilean people the joy of helping their pastor in his time of need.

We should also take an important step in developing our camp ministry before this month is over. We'll bring in an excavator to fill in about three feet of material in an area that currently gets flooded every winter. We'll see how the site handles the upcoming winter and then hope to build our first multi-purpose building at the end of this year. This first building will have a kitchen, bathrooms, and a large meeting area that can serve as chapel, dining hall, and even soccer facilities.
