Dear Praying Friends,

Today is celebrated as Pentecost Sunday in Hungary, and we had a good service today, focusing on the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Tomorrow is also a holiday as part of the long weekend, and we will be having Rami and her son, Milan over to our home. Milan's father might come as well. We appreciate your prayers for this outreach time. Their picture is below. Rami has been open to talking about spiritual things, but she is having a hard time coming to grips with her true spiritual condition. Her son, Milan, is Katie's classmate at preschool.

I had a good visit with Ricsi, one of the men in this group of believers, this week. It is still hard for him to make it out to the service on Sunday, but we had an encouraging time together. He is burdened for his coworkers to trust Christ.

We still haven't had anyone come for our English club at the school on Tuesdays. We feel it's partly due to the fact that it's the end of the year, and we didn't get to promote it as we should have. I talked with the vice principal last week, and he said we can promote it at the end of the summer for the upcoming 8th graders during their orientation days at the school. He thought that would be effective. We are still burdened to reach these young people somehow. They are mostly clueless about spiritual things. During one of our discussions about the founding documents of the United States, I asked, "Who is the Creator they are talking about?" None of the students could answer that basic question.

Sarah and I are praising the Lord that He provided a buyer for our home in Nyíregyháza. God led me to lower the price last month again, and that week we had a family with three children offer to buy the apartment. They put down a deposit, and we will be signing the paperwork on June 4th. We were also able to find a place to buy in Nagykanizsa last week. We will be completing that purchase, Lord-willing, after the sale of our apartment goes through.

I spoke with an immigration lawyer last week, and she confirmed that we will not be able to stay in the country with our existing visa. We are also unable to obtain European Union permanent residency, since our income is based on cost of living in Hungary, which is relatively cheaper, compared to other European countries like Germany. They can only grant the EU visa if we have

the means to live in any country in Europe. She did look at our current volunteer contract with the high school here, and we decided that we could pursue residence based on volunteer status, since we have a contract with a public institution in Hungary. There aren't any other conditions on that, other than the existence of the contract, and the school has allowed us to decide how many hours we will help there. They also agreed to write a 2-year contract for us. This is the maximum length allowed at a time under the law. It appears that God has providentially provided for our residency here through these means. We have to wait until August to apply, but we appreciate your prayers for this process. A lot of being a missionary is just being able to physically live with your family in a foreign country. We don't take that part for granted.

We spent some extra time this week with Attila, and his son, Adam, who come to our Special Olympics group. Please pray for their salvation, and that God would give us spiritual conversations together.

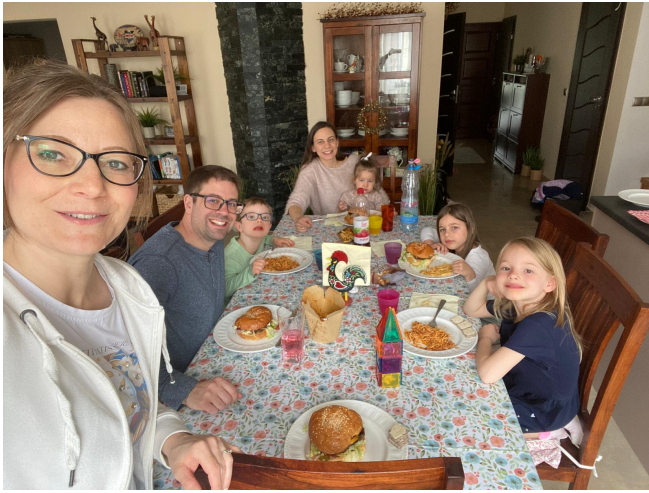
