What a blessing it is to be able to serve the Lord, and to be able to personally testify of the fruit that abounds to the accounts of those who have faithfully prayed for and supported our ministry over the years!

### Ministry

- Our travels over the past two months have been much busier than we anticipated. We have visited 15 different churches for 37 total 'meeting' services. These meetings have been in two U.S. states and two Canadian provinces, and we have spent at least one night in 13 different locations. The love and care that has been shown to us so far in our travels is truly overwhelming! We appreciate your continued **prayers** for God's grace and strength for our family as we travel.
- I regularly spend time connecting virtually with our church leadership in Liberia, dealing with issues that arise and also giving guidance and support when and where needed. Please **continue to pray** for Temple Baptist Church and Prayer Baptist Church.
- The Bible institute continues to go on strong and the semester will soon be drawing to a close. The distance makes it more challenging to coordinate, but I am thankful for those in Liberia who are helping to facilitate things in my absence. A very significant **praise report** from this ministry, is that a new church was planted in the interior of Liberia in March, and both the pastor of the reproducing church and the pastor of the new church plant have been trained in our institute!

### Family Life

- Virtual piano and sign language lessons, although they have been interrupted a couple of times, continue on as we travel. The homeschool calendar has struggled, but we have made some progress in the books.
- With our travels taking us near important sites, we have augmented our history and geography...

...curriculum by visiting significant political and historical sites. We got to meet our Member of Parliament while visiting Ottawa, and we also had the opportunity to visit Washington D.C., Fort McHenry, Niagara Falls, among other sites. This is a special privilege of our present nomadic life!

- We have been able to reconnect with several family friends that we made in Liberia and with some of my extended family. It has also been neat to meet several Liberians in the churches we have visited.
- Our family enjoys watching baseball, and we promised our children that the next time we were on a furlough we would attend a Toronto Blue Jays game in person. We were able to get some cheap 'nosebleed' tickets, and had an amazing time taking in a live baseball game.

### Furlough Plans

- Although we haven't booked our return flights yet, we are at the halfway point of our intended furlough time. We are all very eager to get back to our home, church, and friends in Liberia!
- We still have a number of meetings booked before we get a bit of a break in our schedule for June/July to get some rest and relaxation with family in, and then we have more meetings scheduled all the way up to two weeks prior to our expected return to Liberia.
- I mentioned in our last email that I intended to send out a digital furlough information package to all of those who support our ministry. I have begun that process, but it has taken longer than I expected. I won't make any promises regarding the timeline, but I hope to have that ready soon.

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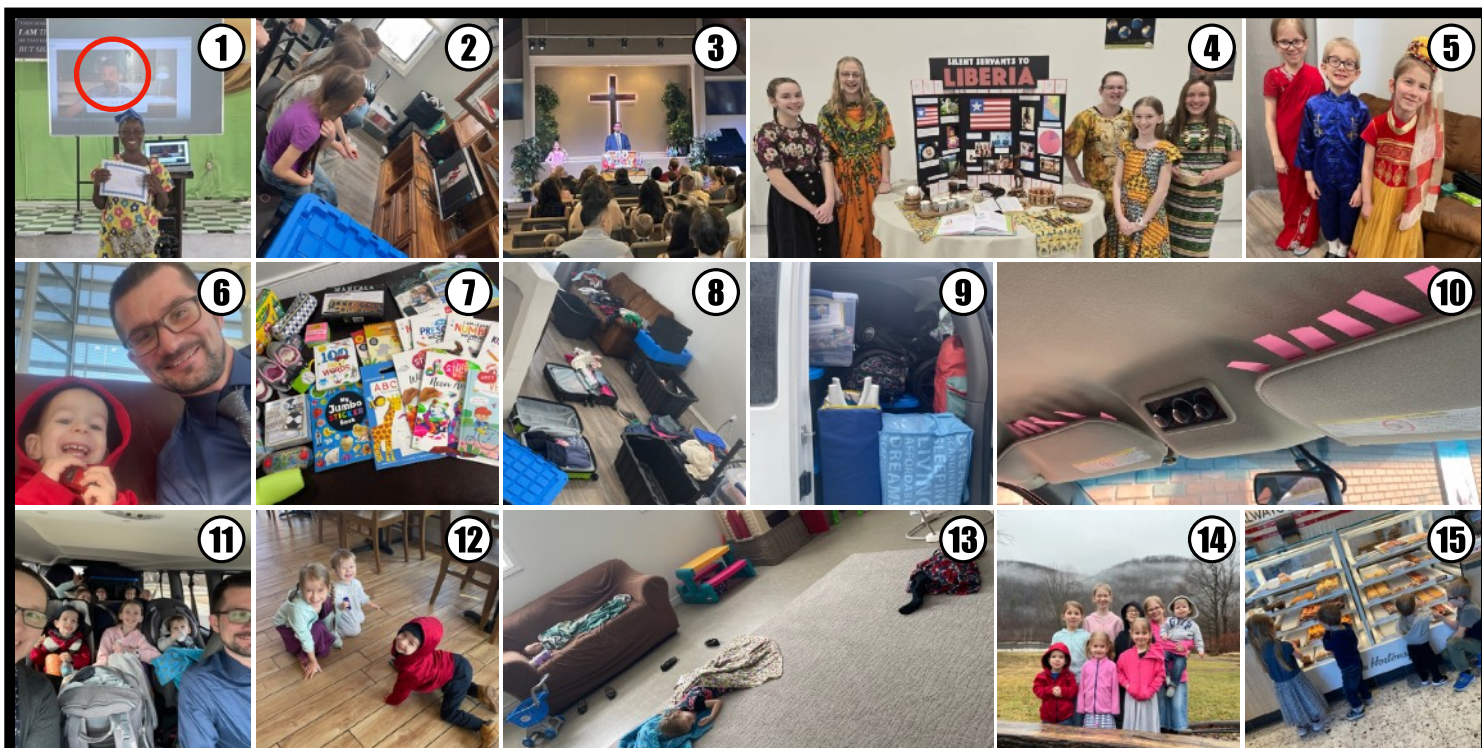

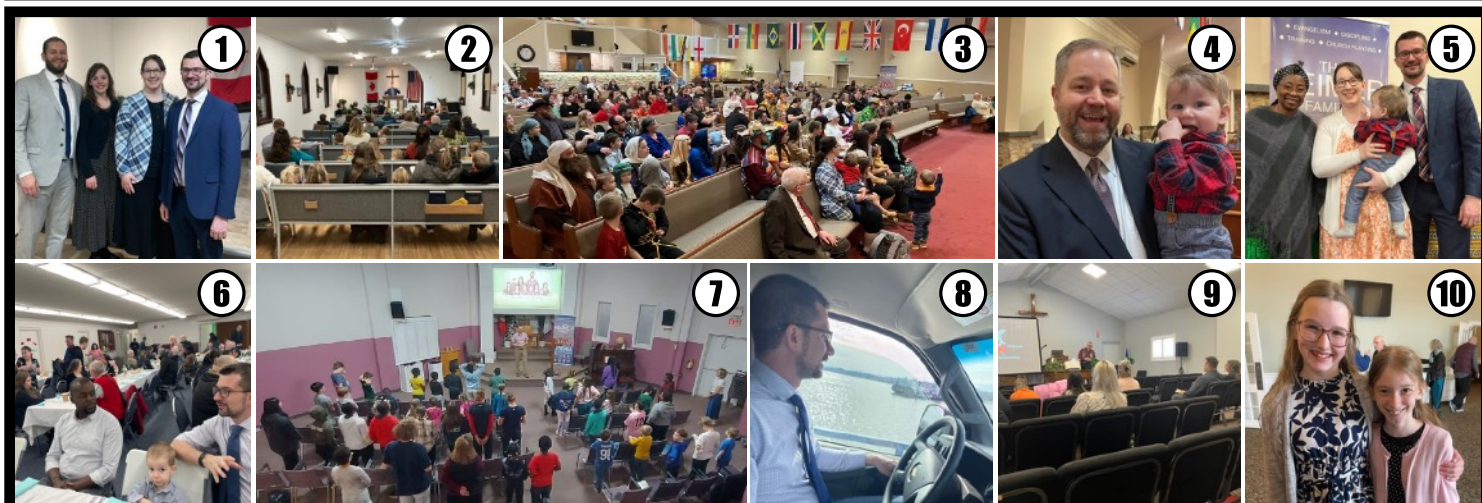

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(1) I am 'virtually' in Liberia regularly, (2-4) we continue Liberian Sign Language classes virtually, Amelia and Caitlyn interpret special music as I sing, and Amelia created a Deaf ministry missions display with some friends in our home church, (5) dressed up for parade of nations, (6-10) our travels began with Micah and I flying to Alabama while Jackie packed and prepared to drive with the other children to meet up with us—the pink papers on the visor represent 15 minutes of travel time, (11-12) reunited in Chicago and a lunch/stretch break while driving, (13) a crash nap on a Sunday afternoon between meetings, (14) a beautiful picture in Pennsylvania while travelling, (15) and some cute vultures waiting patiently for some donuts from Tim Hortons.

(1-2) It was a blessing to reconnect with two different families that we became friends with while serving in Liberia, who are now back living stateside, (3-4) while travelling through Pennsylvania, we got to take a buggy ride through Amish country and tour an Amish farm, (5-7) our travels took us to our capital in Ottawa, where we got to meet our MP (Member of Parliament), get a tour of the Parliament Building, and sit in on the daily Question Period, (8-15) a missions conference in Baltimore, Maryland enabled us to see Fort McHenry (8-9) and tour Washington D.C., with stops at the Washington Monument (10-11), the Lincoln Memorial (12), the U.S. Capitol Building (13), the Supreme Court (14), and the Arlington National Cemetery (15).
