Also, we got a message that our oldest son was hospitalized in the ICU. It was difficult for us to get any information on his condition as the hospital would not share any medical information with us on an international phone call. When we did finally get some information, we found out he was dealing with problems with blood and pancreas issues. Basically, his blood was thickening to where it was like moving jelly through his blood vessels. It was a miracle of God that he didn't have a stroke. He was in ICU for nearly a week and is now on medication for several months to correct the issue. Pray with us that God would heal him completely. It truly is hard being 5,000 miles away when your kids are going through such difficulties, but God is good and we know He has a plan with all these things. Tiffany and I have also been dealing with some gastric issues. Pray that God would lift us up from these issues.

Another challenge that we are dealing with is our vehicle. It has served us well over the last 12 years, but it is starting to have some issues and so we are hoping to replace it. Some churches have already sent some help for this need and I don't like asking as so many have helped over the last few years with building costs and medical needs but we could use just a little more help.
