It feels like this year just barely started, and we are now basically halfway through it. The last couple of months have been full of action and activity, and it has been a blessing to be able to be back with our home church, friends, and family for a while.

Ministry

- The Lord used the Liberian Sign Language special music by Amelia and Caitlyn in one of our supporting churches in Ontario with an existing Deaf ministry, to encourage greater participation and interest in reaching the Deaf. It fills our hearts with joy to see how the Lord is using our family for His glory!
- We wrapped up meetings in Ontario by the end of April, and headed to Tennessee for my graduation from The Crown College. It was a blessing to our entire family to see that ministry up close, and to enjoy the fruit of the many sacrifices that we have made over the past two years.
- During our trip for my grad, we were able to visit the Widow's Jar Ministry in Indianapolis. This is a large warehouse full of mostly new items that have been donated for the purpose of being a blessing to missionaries. We were able to get many things that are going to be a help to our family now and in Liberia.
- Upon our return to Manitoba, we were able to take part in the CanAmera missionary orientation, and I was asked to teach two sessions. We enjoyed the sessions and being able to interact with those who are surrendered to or are already preparing to serve the Lord as missionaries.
- The Lord continues to work in Temple Baptist, and I am able to have a part virtually and also by doing some work via social media from here. A really exciting development since our last letter is the salvation of a teen girl in the church, her baptism, and then her acceptance into the church body—all done by the men who have stepped up to the plate while we are gone!

- While on our way to Tennessee, we were able to spend three days at the Creation Museum and Ark Encounter. This was something that we had been looking forward to for some time, and it was a great experience!
- Being back in Winkler means that we get to spend time with our home church, friends, and family, and we have been quite busy doing all of that. Jackie and I have gotten a few dates, and the children have been biking around town and getting quality time with grandparents and cousins. One highlight for Levi was taking in the annual Father/Son baseball activity hosted by our home church every year at Father's Day. He had been looking forward to it for years!
